She writes slowly and deliberately with shaky fingers on her tablet - a child's magnetic slate that has a slider to clean the slat for a new message. She looks at me hoping for understanding of her message and smiles with her eyes when she knows that I have understood. Jane (not her real name) is 'suffering' from Motor Neuron Disease that has now taken her voice completely. Suffering? Not if you spend time with her. Even though her fingers can no longer let her put jigsaws together, she writes that her faith is strong and her face shows it. There is no fear but confidence in the security that she has in Jesus. One day her present body will be exchanged for a new one – so what's there to be sad about?

Sir William Hall (SWH) hostel has been a new place to get alongside the elderly. There I take church services and make personal visits. Going out with them on their outings has been a great way to get to know them and SWH staff. On two occasions I had been asked if I would come alongside residents in their final days. Sad? In one sense, yes, but to see them brighten up when the Bible is read and they listen again of the Good Shepherd, no sadness, but joyful anticipation. It's really humbling to be in the presence of faith that stands strong in the face of death. Do I make a difference? I know they make a difference to me.

The residents of Gracecourt Units enjoy the various activities of BBQs, movies, games, Wattle Park senior's lunches and church services. Beverley McMurray has got involved with activities in the latter half of this year assisting me as part of her chaplaincy studies. She has proven herself to be a real asset, one who is very approachable. It is my hope that Temcare's Aged Care Chaplaincy will develop with her coming alongside. There is a wide field of opportunity to share Jesus with those who put a high value on a personal visit.

As the Apostle Paul nears his end, he concludes his letter to Titus reminding him of what we have

because of what Jesus has done for us – forgiveness of sins and new life in the Spirit (Titus 3:4-8). It's Jesus; it's all about Jesus.

CARE

We have had another busy year with respite care.

It has been exciting to see some new volunteers come on board as carers, and we are very thankful for the gifts, talents and heart for the work they bring. As usual, I am in awe of the time they so readily give, and the way they integrate these children and young people into their families.

I love to hear all the stories week by week of families building relationship and the blessings that flow both ways between carers, their families and our client families. Some are funny stories about children cracking jokes and making each other laugh at meal times, other stories highlight some of the more challenging behaviours some of our Temcare kids demonstrate at times, and the way our carers respond with strength, wisdom, patience and love. Just recently one of our new carers related the story of their respite child 'having a melt down' in the sand pit, and this carer setting firm boundaries with him so this child knew what was expected of him, but at the same time staying with him and supporting him through this episode so the child did not feel alone or unsupported. I also think of another of our new carer families who have taken on the care of two young disabled girls. This family envisaged caring for one child, but once aware of the need and after prayerful consideration, decided to step up and care for these two delightful girls. The carer family are enjoying the challenge but report being fairly exhausted after a weekend of care. We are so grateful for their commitment and are mindful of what a wonderful thing it is they are offering. It has been many years since this client family have had any sort of overnight break, and they are so thankful for some respite from their usual demanding routine. It's times like this where we see the wonderful benefit of parents and care givers

getting a breather and some time out, and I feel glad for the positive impact of this ministry, of its role in supporting families and in some cases ensuring the family stays intact.

As you read this report I pray you will be richly blessed as you enjoy catching up on the work of Temcare this past year. It is heartening to see growth in the ministry with new volunteers coming on board and being able to make a dent in our ever growing wait list, and look forward to welcoming more new families who can be blessed with the support respite care offers.

Thank you for your interest, encouragement and support. Please continue to support us in prayer and other ways you feel led.



Mates

This past year has been a year of growth for the Mates program. I took on the role as the new Mates worker in January 2014 following Tosari finishing up in December 2013. We began the year a little slow, as there was a lot of sorting that occurred with current matches and which ones were coming to an end. We then had an influx of new mentors, who we were able to interview, train, accredit and match. This has been an exciting time of fresh faces that bring a new enthusiasm to the program.

This year the partnership between Temcare and Prison Fellowship began. Prison Fellowship had a preexisting mentoring program that consisted of a few functioning matches that required on-going support. The program has now come under the Mates banner and the matches have integrated into the program well. We are seeing more interested volunteers coming in to fill the gaps in the evergrowing waiting list. The mentees within this section of the program, generally have or have had a parent in prison. Many live in the foster care system or with a single parent.

We have run several group activities every few months to further connect the mentors and mentees to each other. These 'catch ups' are also vital in providing a sense of belonging to each other for the mentees and entertain the concept of us all being a family. The mentees look forward to seeing each other and develop deep and lasting friendships. Our catch ups this year consisted of; Curnow Tennis Activity Evening, Oakleigh Indoor Sports, Rooftop Cinema, North Melbourne Vs Gold Coast Suns football game and football clinic at North Melbourne Football Club. Through these catch ups a thriving community is formed and relationships and friendships are deepened and strengthened with more regular activities and contacts. Our mentors are such generous people who give of their time and skills to really better the lives of the young people they are matched with. Our mentors bring to the program an understanding of the modern day struggles for youth in our community and an ability to work through issues as they arise in a way that reflects Gods love, grace and compassion in every circumstance.

Temcare identifies as a family, which is reflective in the cross over between our COACH, Care and Mates programs. This is a wonderful attribute where families are connected in multiple programs. Many young people this year have transitioned from the Respite Care program to the Mates program which allows them to remain connected and provides vital guidance in a stage in life that is full of changes and transitions.









Total amount of Mates Contacts: 107

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Christian Brethren Community Care Ltd (the company), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2014, the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the directors' declaration.

Directors' Responsibility for the Financial Report

Those standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the directors, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

In conducting our audit, we have complied with the independence requirements of the *Australian and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012.*
