Well, 2020 has so far been a challenging year. Commencing with heatwaves and massive bushfires, the nation then experienced floods and finally the Coronavirus. Many people have reflected on how these experiences have been the worst they have known in living history, whilst others have placed them in the context of; past world wars, the 1918 Spanish Flu epidemic, and the 'Great Depression' of the early 1930's.



Whatever your perspective, 2020 has clearly been complex and difficult for many individuals, families, churches, Christian agencies, and businesses. During this period, some have questioned the existence of God and/or His mercy and grace in the face of their despair.

Recently, our Facebook page displayed the following message:


"~ Carry Each Other's Burdens ~

Throughout this crisis Temcare has attempted to be a 'burden carrier' for the many families and individuals whom we serve. Although restricted by the COVID-19 social distancing requirements, staff have nevertheless been very creative and faithful in trying to maintain contact with clients and volunteers, whilst also seeking to directly support as many of our clients in appropriate and practical ways.

Our families have experienced heightened levels of personal and familial stress that have tested their capacity to adequately function. The support they have received from staff has assisted many to see 'God's light' at the end of their dark personal tunnels.





We have also been enormously encouraged by the support provided by you, our incredibly faithful and generous supporters during these times. For example, in response to the request for funds to support a 'fresh food' program for our clients, people donated just over \$6,000. We are in the process of using these funds to purchase and deliver 'fresh food' hampers every fortnight to clients in need. We also continue to regularly distribute general food hampers provided by members of Belmore Road Church of Christ. A recent donation of 20 Mother's Day hampers from one of our supporters enabled us to bless some of our mothers.



Some of our staff recently reported on the responses from mothers who received 'fresh food' hampers, along with some other items donated by our financial supporters. Here are some of their comments:

"Hey Nev, a good news story for you. Yesterday as part of our massive delivery coordination of gifts, hampers etc. I gave one of the mother's day gifts to a mum whose daughter is part of the MATES program. She was the one who thanked us for taking her daughter on camp saying that she felt like she had her old daughter back again. Anyway I left the gift on her doorstep and she has never received anything from our program before. I told her she's a fantastic mother and does an amazing job. Last night I received a text from her thanking

us so much for the surprise. She was so grateful and moved that she cried tears of joy. She was really blown away that we thought of her."

"M was so grateful for the groceries and said that you wouldn't believe how much she appreciated this. She's missed fresh fruit and has been surviving on frozen veggies, which she said isn't too nice. When she saw the fresh milk she was even more excited and said that she was actually needing milk. She said it was so helpful and she wanted to thank us all for thinking of her and [her daughter]."

"D was really excited by the devotional book."

"Worker dropped over a Mother's day gift and devotional book. M said they were coping fine with having to be at home. They've done a lot of cooking so she jokingly said the only problem was they would get quite big if this didn't end soon. She seemed to be in good spirits. M gave the gift to her son, because she'd told him he could give it to her on Mother's Day."

"Worker dropped a fresh food hamper over. D answered the door and was incredibly thankful for the food. She kept saying how much they appreciated it. Two of her children who came to the door were really excited by the bag of fresh food too."
