Chairman's Report

The account of Joseph which commences in Genesis chap. 37 is a wonderful record of God's faithfulness to a young man whose heart was pure and devoted to Him, even in the midst of familial treachery, brotherly hatred, temptation and undeserved imprisonment. God had a plan for him, even though his father, his brothers and Joseph himself could not initially see it. Over twelve years in prison and separation from his homeland and his beloved father did not diminish Joseph's faith in and love for God.

But after all he went through at the hands of his brothers and his lengthy imprisonment there was no place in his heart for bitterness, petulance, or self-pity. His heart remained true and he was ready to be an instrument of good for the God of his fathers. His trials were simply a training period and when God was ready to use Joseph for His glory, Joseph was ready and available however God chose to use him.

This past year Temcare has seen numerous unforeseen challenges. There have been unexpected staff movements, insurance difficulties and ongoing health concerns for the Executive Manager. In such times it is important to keep our eyes fixed on God and not become preoccupied with the things that trouble us. John said in chap. 16:33 that in the world we will have tribulation and sorrow, but we need to endure these moments with courage and good cheer because He has already won the victory over sin and its consequences.

Temcare remains committed to obeying God's calling to honour Him and share His message of hope and love with the vulnerable and suffering in our world. The Respite and Mates programs continue to operate although on a more limited

basis, but are ready to increase intensity as circumstances become more optimal. The new Nurture and Hope programs are exciting and represent opportunities to serve new sectors of the community. The Hope program has received a significant number of referrals, and Nurture has begun connecting with single Mums and offering tangible and emotional/spiritual support.

This past year has also seen some challenges as our principal financial supporter has amended their support level. Nevertheless, we can praise God that He has opened new doors of support, for which we praise Him. Temcare remains on a sound financial footing as evidenced in our most recent Audit report.

We know that God has a plan for Temcare, just as He had a plan for Joseph. No matter what challenges confront us we will continue to trust Him and remain ready and willing to serve Him as and when He provides opportunity.

Thank you again for your valued prayers and support, and I trust that you enjoy reading this Annual Report.

CEO's Report



It is an honour for me to present my third Annual Report, as indeed it is to have the privilege of leading an organization such as Temcare.

As we reflect on another eventful and impactful year at Temcare, I am filled with gratitude for the unwavering support of our community, our volunteers, donors, directors, dedicated staff, our families, referring agencies and organizations, our partners and prayerful friends.

Since 1968, Temcare has remained steadfast in its mission to encourage and empower families and individuals across Victoria.

Guided by our Bible-based Christian values, we continue to reflect Jesus' love through practical, compassionate support, fostering hope and opportunity for those we serve.

As with previous years, this year has seen our programs touch many lives, delivering meaningful outcomes in the face of growing challenges.

In 2025, Temcare continued to expand its reach through our program areas: NURTURE, HOPE, Sports Sponsorship, school holiday camps, Respite Care, Mentoring, Food and Christmas hampers, and our beloved annual Temcare Family Camp, which this year was held at CYC Adanac.

Temcare's new HOPE initiative has started to gain traction, providing opportunities for us to reach out to and help families and children of prisoners in various practical ways.

The NURTURE program offers a lifeline for mothers with young families, providing practical assistance like food bags and gift baskets, friendship, emotional and material support, helping parents navigate the joys and demands of early parenthood.

The program's growth this coming year is envisaged through the beginning of NURTURE Groups by Temcare, meeting monthly in local churches. Our first group has started in Ringwood North. The needs are growing, and God willing, this may be the start of a wider work as we grow our NURTURE morning tea groups around Victoria.

If your church would like to investigate starting a Temcare NURTURE morning tea group, please get in touch. We can help with everything required for you to set up your own NURTURE group for you to reach out to mothers in your community.

Our Respite Care services have continued to offer short-term breaks for families, ensuring children experience a safe, loving environment while parents' recharge. Over the years this program, alongside our annual Family Camp has fostered new friendships and strengthened community bonds.

For well over two decades, our Family Camp has provided a welcome holiday for families in our programs, creating cherished memories and a sense of belonging.

Similarly, our offer of free family and school holiday camps at CYC campsites across Victoria has strengthened the bonds of family and empowered disadvantaged youth to build confidence and purpose.



The Mentoring program and our Sports Sponsorship initiative reflect our commitment to encouraging the potential of youth. By connecting young people with mentors, and providing opportunities in sports, we aim to bridge gaps in access and opportunity.

As a donation-dependent organization, Temcare relies entirely on the generosity of individuals, churches, businesses, and charitable trusts. This year, we've been heartened by the continued and increased support that enables us to operate without government funding.

Every contribution, whether financial or through volunteer time, has directly impacted lives—whether through a food bag, a camp experience, or sport sponsorship.

Looking ahead, we are excited to deepen our impact in 2026 by expanding our programs and strengthening partnerships with local organizations.

Despite general economic pressures, post-restructure challenges, and some personal health issues, Temcare's financial situation has been greatly blessed by God in the past year.

Financially, we finish the 2024/25 financial year with a net profit of \$175,578, compared to a net profit last year of \$105,425, as we continue to prepare to be able to weather economic uncertainty and ensure the continuation of our services long term. We have a comfortable net cash balance of over \$600,000, placing us on a sound financial footing to confidently continue our programs and indeed consider expanding them in the coming year.

With our restructure behind us, a rigorous cost-cutting and

frugal spending mentality in place, our focus will continue to be on financially sustainable programs, part-time staff, and programs which can make a difference in the lives of families and individuals both now and for eternity.

Personally, due to some serious health issues, I will be stepping down from full-time duties. We will be employing a part-time Senior Social Worker in October, and an Executive Program Manager around the same time. God willing, I will stay on as part-time CEO for the foreseeable future.

Our vision remains clear: to create a hope-filled future for families and children.

Together, with your support, we will continue our mission one family at a time.

Can I conclude by conveying my personal gratitude to you for your encouraging support of Temcare, your financial support, and generally to the many people who have greatly encouraged our ministry.

As a Presbyterian, when I started as CEO in April 2023, I was initially unfamiliar with the open Brethren movement that founded Temcare back in 1968. I have since thoroughly enjoyed getting to know the movement's history and its continuing widespread ministry involvement.

While Temcare has developed into a multi-denominationally supported ministry, with a Board made up of three Anglicans, a Baptist, two from Christian Community churches and one Presbyterian, it was a Holy Spirit-filled Brethren movement that started this cherished organization. We are thankful for this heritage.

It is evident to me that God has used the movement for many decades to do good things, in Australia and overseas, and I am sure, when we are in Heaven, we will find out there has been much fruit from these efforts.

I was particularly fascinated to learn of the Brethren's involvement in founding the Kurrawang Aboriginal Mission, in 1951, outside of Kalgoorlie, given that I went through primary school with children from the mission at Kalgoorlie Central Primary School, had many friends from the mission, and had visited there on numerous occasions. Below is a photo of some of these children and my brother Ian, in 1973, when Johnny Cash visited the mission.

About Temcare

In its various forms, Temcare has been serving families and individuals in Victoria since approximately 1968 and presently operates from offices in Ringwood North.

What is Temcare?

It is a professionally operated Christian community support agency, that reflects the love of Jesus in our wider community in many practical ways. It is a Christian mission organization whose mission ground is right here in Victoria. It is a mercy ministry that helps families and children in need and also provides opportunities for individual Christians, congregations, and Christian businesses and schools to be a part of intentionally revealing this love to people in the community, especially those who need a helping hand, are hurting, distressed and are vulnerable.

Why?

Our motivation is partly summed up in Luke 10:25-37, where Jesus outlines some of what His people are to be doing while waiting for Heaven. In this parable, the man from Samaria provided costly, sacrificial, and thorough practical assistance to his enemy lying half-dead on the Jericho Road. It is a picture of what Jesus did for each of His people, and it is a call from Jesus to each one of us to, "Go and do likewise." (Luke 10:37)

Jesus wants His people to provide practical care actively, generously, and intentionally, for people in need in our community, and Jesus himself is our model of compassion and practical help.

Founded in 1968 in response to the undeserved grace and mercy Jesus has shown us, Temcare provides temporary practical care motivated by this everlasting love of Jesus. This is the love we desire to reveal to and share with others, through practical acts of kindness, care, and love, unashamedly provided in the name of Jesus. This can in turn provide hope for the hopeless, love for the unloved, and belonging for the lost and alone.



This practical Christianity in turn reveals Jesus to our wider community and brings glory to God. It presents the Church in a positive light to a cynical and misinformed world and provides many points of contact between the two, with all the individual, community, and nation-changing impacts this can have.

Christians want to be active in practical ways in their community and Temcare is a platform for churches across many denominations to facilitate this participation, for Temcare to be their partner in community outreach through mercy ministry services.

With its staff, board, good governance, accredited volunteers, church supporters, generous donors, and long history, Temcare is a platform from which to expand this mission together, God willing.



What Does Temcare Do?

Temcare provides a range of services for families and individuals in need within the Victorian community.

Temcare's programs aim to:

Strengthen core intrapersonal and interpersonal life skills for family members.

Facilitate responsive and positive relationships between parents and their children.

Reduce sources of stress for children, adolescents and family members.

Introduce clients to those aspects of the Christian faith that will enhance their interpersonal and intrapersonal functioning.

We believe that these program goals will be most effectively facilitated by:

Enhancing an individual's emotional and social development.

Supporting parents to provide appropriate levels of care for their children.

Improving social / emotional / educational / outcomes for children and adolescents.

Facilitating a person's interest in exploring matters of the Christian faith that are relevant to their overall well-being.

In terms of the latter, and only with the clear permission of the person, Temcare endeavours to assist parents, children and adolescents to:

Develop a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

Become connected to and established in a local supportive church of their preference.

Grow in their Christian faith journey.

Wanted: Men Who Understand the Times

“Don’t let anyone capture you with empty philosophies and high-sounding nonsense that come from human thinking and from the spiritual powers of this world, rather than from Christ.” (Colossians 2:8)

In an era where truth feels like a relic and chaos masquerades as progress, we find ourselves at a crossroads. Picture this: a young man scrolls endlessly through his feed, bombarded by viral outrage, fleeting trends, and polished propaganda. One moment, he’s laughing at a meme; the next, he’s wrestling with doubts about his purpose, his place in a world unravelling at the seams.

Sound familiar? It’s the soundtrack of our time—a symphony of confusion, where ancient wisdom is dismissed as outdated and bold conviction is branded as bigotry.

This is no accident. It’s a calculated fog, a cultural darkness draped in the bright lights of social media filters and celebrity endorsements. The cost? Sleepless nights, fierce opposition, the sting of rejection. But the reward? A legacy of light piercing the shadows, families fortified, nations renewed. In the words of the ancient chronicler, these will be like the sons of Issachar—discerning the signs of the age and rising to meet them (1 Chronicles 12:32).

To the young men reading this, whether you’re 14 or 58, just starting out or re-evaluating mid-journey, hear this: Your training ground is now.

Don't outsource your formation to the echo chambers of secular education alone. Sure, chase that degree; it's a tool in your arsenal, opening doors to influence. But true wisdom isn't minted in modern lecture halls—it's forged in the quiet discipline of independent study. Dive into the classics: Plato's dialogues on justice, Aristotle's meditations on virtue, Jane Austen's sharp wit on human folly. Above all, let the Bible be your compass.

Its pages aren't dusty relics; they're a living blueprint for navigating chaos. Read voraciously. Our upcoming heroes (of which you could be one) will not, and history's victors did not binge Netflix; they built empires of the mind, reading one page at a time.

Layer on practical skills. Study law to grasp the scaffolding of society, theology to anchor your soul. Whether you're enlisting as a soldier, arguing cases in court, banging a hammer as a carpenter, shaping minds as a teacher, shaping policy as a politician, or proclaiming truth from a pulpit, these disciplines sharpen your edge.

Dedicate an hour each evening to this intellectual forge. Ditch the doom-scrolling; trade pixels for principles. Your mind is a muscle, train it relentlessly, and it will carry you through debates, dilemmas, and dark days.

And don't neglect the temple of your body. In a world that worships comfort, strength is rebellion. Do 50 push-ups every day. Hit the gym. Make fitness a lifestyle: run through rain-slicked streets, eat meals fueled by real food, not fast-fashion calories. Learn nutrition not as a fad but as stewardship, your form is the vessel for your fight.

A strong body steels the spirit; it whispers, "You can endure" when the battle rages.

Now, pivot to the heart of legacy: Jesus, marriage and family. Life's brevity stares us down. Decades, not earthly eternities. Yet within these decades lie the purest of earthly joys: knowing Jesus, the covenant of marriage, the chaos and wonder of raising children. These aren't luxuries; they're the crucibles where character is refined. Don't let the world's cynics—those peddling "hustle culture" or "self-actualization" myths—talk you out of it.

God doesn't dangle provision like a carrot on a stick; He rains it down in season. You don't need a six-figure salary or a paid-off house to start. Begin with commitment, and watch struggles morph into shared triumphs: late-night talks that bind souls, tiny hands that teach humility, milestones that etch gratitude into your bones.

The current epidemic of confusion, where youth chase validation in algorithms rather than authenticity in community. Mental fragility, spreading by design, isn't a coincidence; it's the fruit of lies sown deep, often from kindergarden. If you believe the lies, you will suffer the mental confusion.

These narratives are brittle facades, propped up by deception. Poke them, and they crumble—no bedrock, just shifting sands.

Your role? Accelerate the collapse of the lies.

Arm yourself with truth, wielded boldly, persistently, courageously. Speak it in boardrooms, schoolyards, universities, trade schools, at the footy, in backyards, and ballot boxes. Put it out there on social media.

Expose the grooming in schools, the exploitation in media, the erosion of innocence everywhere.

You'll draw allies—disillusioned souls hungry for honesty. Lead them not with bluster, but with fidelity to Jesus, the ultimate Truth-bearer. Stick to Scripture as your playbook; it has outlasted empires for a reason.



Victory isn't a maybe—it's assured. Lies self-destruct; truth endures. As you fight, remember: Following Jesus isn't one option among many. It's the apex of existence—the path to unshakeable joy, profound peace, ironclad purpose, and eternal horizon.

No cause rivals following Jesus. Philanthropy feeds bodies; activism stirs crowds; ambition builds fortunes. But Christ changes lives and redeems souls. He turns orphans into heirs, wanderers into warriors, despair into dawn.

True friendship flows from this well. A real friend doesn't flatter with fables; they confront with clarity, pulling you from the pit.

Progressives, for all their often false "compassion," peddle illusions that chain rather than liberate.

Be the antidote: the voice saying, "This way leads to life." Free the captives—those shackled by Marxist mirages (left or right), welfare webs, pharmaceutical fogs, counterfeit counsel, debt's drag, or screens' siren song.

Echo the psalmist's vision: God "upholds the cause of the oppressed... sets prisoners free... lifts up those who are bowed down" (Psalm 146:7-9). Be His hands in a cowered world.

Resources? They're manifold, and yours for the claiming. "For every beast of the forest is mine, and the cattle upon a thousand hills" (Psalm 50:10).

Hone the art of provision: work diligently to earn, wisely to save, shrewdly to invest. Frugality isn't deprivation; it's freedom from stuff's tyranny.

Yet fixate not on finances—trust Jesus, the Provider. He'll orchestrate surprises that bolster your faith. Journal them; they'll fuel the fire for others.

Courage, then, is your creed. Like Issachar's sons, discern and act. Defend the weak—the poor, the child, the widow—with the ferocity of a lion and the tenderness of a shepherd.

"Blessed are those who have regard for the weak; the Lord delivers them in times of trouble" (Psalm 41:1-2).

In this rotten culture's grip, be the liberator.

Love seals the summons. We crave it—to give, to receive, to belong. Yet the world's version is a shallow echo: fleeting flings, conditional affection, weak vows. God's love? It's sacrificial, transformative—the Father giving His Son so we might live (John 3:16). To love Him is to obey: cherish neighbours (Matthew 19:19), shepherd the distressed (James 1:27), serve all with good (Galatians 6:10). Be the Good Samaritan in traffic jams and Twitter storms; feed the hungry, heal the hurting, visit the forgotten (Matthew 25:35-36).

This love demands truth-telling. Lies about creation, history, marriage, gender, race, climate—they're modern idols, fracturing lives. When you hear them—on campuses, in headlines, at dinner tables—stand firm. Correct with grace, but correct nonetheless.

God orchestrates by truth; align your life to it, and watch providence unfold.

Young men, the hour is yours. No billboards or lightning bolts required, step forward today. For two millennia, Christ's followers have testified: This is the grandest adventure.

Surrender to Him; let Him captain your course. Read the Bible daily—not as drudgery, but delight. Its truths preserved civilization through plagues and persecutions; now, guard them against the cancellers' tide.

They mock the faithful as "weird" or "deplorable," but their arsenal is empty—hopelessness masquerading as hope. Jesus triumphs every time (Acts 4:12).

Rise, then. Understand the times. Know what to do, and do it. Be the men the world needs—and the sons your Father calls. The darkness flees at dawn's first light. Will you carry the torch?

Report on the Financial Report

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Christian Brethren Community Care Limited (the company), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2025, the statement of profit or loss and comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of material accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the directors' declaration.

In our opinion the financial report of Christian Brethren Community Care Limited is in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001*, including:

- giving a true and fair view of the company's financial position as at 30 June 2025 and of its performance for the year ended on that date; and
- complying with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in the notes and complying with the *Corporations Regulations 2001*.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report* section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the auditor independence requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001* and the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 *Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants* (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We confirm that the independence declaration required by the *Corporations Act 2001*, which has been given to the directors of the Company, would be in the same terms if given to the directors as at the time of this auditor's report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to notes to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the directors' financial reporting responsibilities under the *Corporations Act 2001*. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

Directors' Responsibility for the Financial Report

The directors of the company are responsible for the preparation of the financial report and have determined that the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial report are appropriate to meet the requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001* and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. The directors' responsibility also includes such internal control as the directors determine is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of this financial report.

As part of an audit in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Company's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the directors.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the directors' use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial report or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial report, including the disclosures, and whether the financial report represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with the directors regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.
